Anita Lasker Wallfisch, an important protagonist, last year held a speech in the German Bundestag at the Holocaust memorial ceremony. This year is the 81 st anniversary of pogrom night. The chapter "Pogrom Night" plays an elementary role in the memories of all protagonists.

Requiem for a Polish boy

Composer: Dietrich Lohff (1941 - 2016)

The "Requiem for a Polish Boy" is reminiscent of Benjamin Britten's "War Requiem" (1961) in both content and music. The composer Dietrich Lohff has shown a way without accusing: with his work he has taken a stand against oblivion: He allows the victims themselves to have their say. The eight parts of the oratorio are based on texts by victims of fascism. The "Requiem for a Polish Boy" (1997/98) is a musical memorial against oblivion. The work has already experienced numerous performances in Germany, among others on January 27,1999 in the German Bundestag on the occasion of a ceremony commemorating the liberation of the Auschwitz concentration camp.

Dietrich Lohff writes about his "Requiem": "Church music must not remain silent, it has done so for far too long. It must be possible for it to make the suffering that fascism has brought to millions of people audible by giving the victims a soft - but clear - voice.

"When now slowly the generation of eyewitnesses of the perpetrators and victims dies, it is up to us to admonish, to remind. Even if it is painful and embarrassing. This is what should happen with this performance." Andrea Schwager

Reading: "The transformation" by Franz Kafka

The Transformation begins with one of the most popular first sentences in world literature: 'When Gregor Samsa woke up one morning from restless dreams, he found himself in his bed transformed into a tremendous vermin'. The narrative world of the text unfolds from this first sentence, which rigorously breaks with the rules of realistic representation. Gregor Samsa, cloth merchant and breadwinner of the family, duty-consciously tries to start the planned business trip despite his transformation, but soon finds out that his sight not only horrifies his parents and sister, but also that he can no longer make himself understood...

The Transformation fascinates with its crystal clear and at the same time enigmatic

style and has inspired many different interpretations.

In the reading by Florian Lukas the fantastic transformation process of Gregor Samsas, an almost oppressive family story and the lack of empathy with the 'different' come together impressively.



The Detmold dancer, choreographer and teacher Ulrike von der Linden writes about this project:



"In the summer of 2015, I experienced the arrival of inflatable boats with refugees from Syria and Iraq on the Greek island of Samos, looked people in the eye and decided to do something. The novel "ALMA" by Dagmar Fohl, which appeared in 2017 and tells the

story of the music dealer and cellist Aaron Stern and his family during the Nazi era, made it clear to me once again that for many Jewish fellow citizens at that time the situation was similar to that of the fugitives today. They, too, were rejected by many countries in their attempt to flee from death; ships were not allowed to call at ports, and people were sent back in most cases to certain death.

As the title of the novel is the first name of my granddaughter (since 28.2.2019 a member of the Jewish Community of Berlin and 14 years old), the decision was quickly made to read parts of the novel together with her in turn and to listen to the music, preferably played on the cello. The cellist Max Gundermann, winner of the Auryn Chamber Music Competition with the Arminius Quartet, could be won. With this project we want to build a bridge between the fate of countless Jewish fellow citizens during the National Socialist era and the many people who today are fleeing all over the world and encounter similar inhuman behaviour."



Faten Mukarker, Bethlehem



During our last trip to Israel and Palestine we got to know Mrs. Mukarker in her place of residence as a fascinating and understanding authority on the Israel-Palestine conflict. Her lecture will focus on the special conditions of everyday life as a Palestinian Christian. She asks: "On both sides of the wall there are people who believe in a just peace. But which obstacles must be overcome so that the two peoples can finally again find a peaceful coexistence, perhaps even togetherness? In an impressive way Mrs. Mukarker tells her story and makes it clear that she desires nothing more than to live without fear, free and self-determined in her own viable state next to the state of Israel.

All of them are connected with each other and fatefully with the formerly red Wedding, this poor district of Berlin - with the run-down house in Utrechter Straße. Leo, who returns to Germany from Israel after 70 years, although he never really wanted to. His granddaughter Nira, who loves Amir, who opened a falafel snack bar in Berlin. Laila, who doesn't even know that her Sinti family once lived here. And finally old Gertrud, who discovered Leo and his friend Manfred in 1944 in their hiding place in the attic, but did not betray them. Regina Scheer, the well-known Berlin narrator of German history (including "Machandel"), has woven the lives of her protagonists into a literary work full of truthfulness and human warmth.
