Exhibition "Jewish Traces in Detmold" at the Bruchmauer

On Friday, 8 April 2022, at 2 p.m., the exhibition "Jewish Traces in Detmold" will open at the Bruchmauer.

Last year, students of the Israel-AG of the Grabbe-Gymnasium, led by Oliver Arnhold and Elisabeth Hecker, developed a digital city tour based on the book "Auf jüdischen Spuren" by Gudrun Mitschke-Buchholz. In an abbreviated form, some stations of this tour will be exhibited on banners at the Bruchmauer in Detmold from 8 April 2022.

The opening will feature contributions from representatives of the city, the city archives, the Jewish Community Herford-Detmold, the GfCJZ and the Christian-Dietrich-Grabbe-Gymnasium.
